Recent U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) rules require child care facilities nationwide to use only cribs that meet 2010 testing and design requirements of American Society for Testing and Materials standard F1169-10 for full-size cribs, or standard F406-10a for non-full-size cribs. See Federal Register Volume 75, Number 248, pages 81765-81788. Child care facilities have until December 28, 2012 to replace cribs that do not meet the federal standards.
