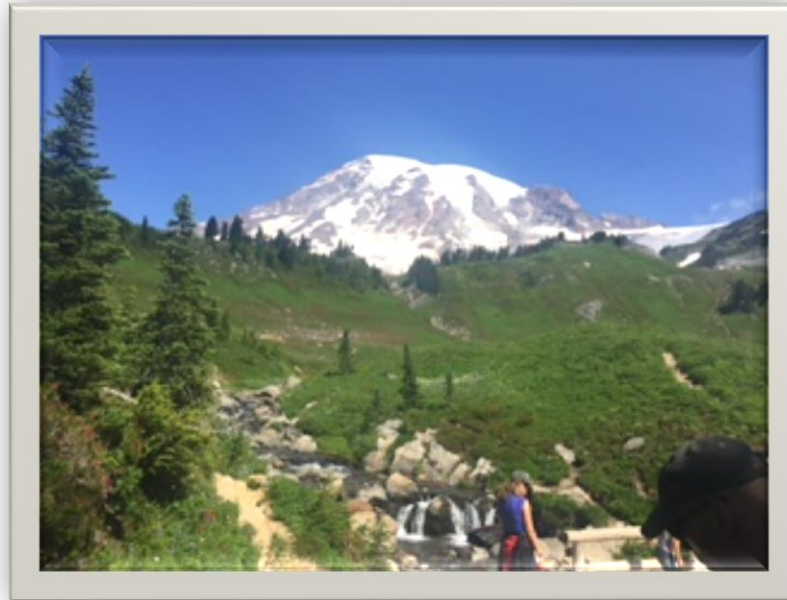

SSIP Budget

- 🕒 Goods and Services

SSIP Impact

“The training opportunities and reflective supervision have had the greatest impact on our team. Having our entire team trained in promoting first relationships and others with level 2 and 3 training has changed the way our team views the caregiver- child relationship, and the way that we support that relationship.

That foundation has helped us shift the way we view behaviors in the context of social emotional development and attachment. Our team coaching and support for each other and the families we serve has become deeper and more sensitive with monthly reflective consultation. We are grateful for the support that has been provided through the SSIP efforts!”
