By June 30, 2017: SICC Committee Interest Forms due to DEL

By August 4, 2017: SICC Committee Recruitment Review by SICC Chair, Committee Chairs and ESIT Staff

By August 11, 2017: SICC Committee Recruitments Notified

About the State Interagency Coordinating Council (SICC):

In accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Part C, the SICC was re-established by Executive Order 14-03 on March 13, 2014.

The mission of the SICC is to coordinate and foster development of a comprehensive statewide system of accessible local early intervention services for children birth to age 3 who have disabilities or are at risk for developing disabilities and their families, and to coordinate transition of these children into programs for 3- to 6-year-olds.

SICC promotes and supports family involvement and family-centered services. The statewide early intervention system will be collaborative and community-based. The early intervention services will be consistent and accessible to families and children statewide; the services will be of high quality, efficient, timely, and maintain flexibility and manageability.

Eligibility

Committee membership criteria and time commitments, including but not limited to:

- Must be able to commit to attending committee meetings
- Committee Members are not required to be a member of the SICC
- Interested individuals that are not part of a committee, may be selected to participate in a consultant role or as part of a work group or task force to support the committee work
- To achieve a balanced membership on the committees, ESIT and the SICC will recommend appointments while considering, among other factors, geographic representation, expertise, parent/caregiver, and early intervention roles.
