Contractor Fiscal Reviews for FY 17

DEL ECEAP will be conducting fiscal reviews of ECEAP contractors beginning in January 2017. The purpose of these reviews will be to ensure ECEAP funds are used only for ECEAP allowable costs and contractors are in compliance with all financial provisions of the ECEAP Contract, including ECEAP Performance Standards. DEL ECEAP will ask selected contractors to submit documentation to show compliance with the following contractual requirements:

- DEL ECEAP funds are used only for ECEAP allowable costs
- Costs are fairly allocated to ECEAP
- Policies and procedures are followed
- Internal controls are in place to prevent fraud
- Monitoring of sub-contractors, if applicable

Reviews will begin in early January and DEL anticipates completing 6-8 fiscal reviews this year. Contractors who have been selected will receive notification within the coming weeks.

Document each child's developmental, health, and dental screening and well-child exam in ELMS.

DEL Cost of Quality Project

Beginning the first week in November, DEL will be working with a small group of existing ECEAP contractors to kick off the DEL Cost of Quality Project. The purpose of the project is to explore and clarify the true costs of providing quality ECEAP (and child care) services in Washington. The project will sample a broad range of providers (from ECEAP to family child care homes to child care centers) and will help us understand the current landscape of costs (including where gaps exist) to provide quality services to meet varying levels of quality as outlined in Early Achievers standards and ECEAP Performance Standards. Stay tuned for updates over the next couple of months.

Coach Consultation Available to All Coaches

CQEL at the University of Washington is launching a new system for scheduling and providing consultation for coaches! Starting in 2016-17 they are extending this resource to ECEAP and Head Start coaches. Monthly consultation is *optional* and available for everyone coaching in Early Achievers.

The Coach Support Team provides individual consultation with coaches related to each coach's specific work and professional development goals. Coach and consultant pairs meet monthly, and go through the Practice-Based Coaching cycle of goal setting, observation and feedback, and reflection. This individual consultation creates a venue in which coaches can problem-solve and connect to specific resources, and in which consultants can ensure that each coach is fully supported as they use the Coach Model with early educators. If you're a new coach, once you've completed their two-day New Coach Training, you will have the opportunity to receive consultation with Wendy Jans or West Keller for three months following the training.

Once you've confirmed your appointment, you'll receive an email confirmation with the date, time and consultant you chose. Please note that you will be asked to provide a phone number for the consultant to reach you. All consultation is provided via the phone. Teaching Strategies GOLD®

- Fall Checkpoints:
 - Teachers must finalize the fall checkpoint in *GOLD*® by November 15.
 - Ratings are required for Social-Emotional, Physical, Language, Cognitive, Literacy, and Mathematics. It is very important that finalized ratings are entered for all six of these domains, for every child.
 - DEL will monitor that all ratings are entered. If any are missing, teachers will need to enter them as the child's development indicated on November 15.

- Known Issues:
 - If you have any enrolled ECEAP children who are not in *GOLD*®, first make sure you've entered their "actual start date" in ELMS. If they are not in *GOLD*® 36 hours after you did this, email the ELMS Child IDs and Class Names to del.wa@teachingstrategies.com.
 - The Comparative Report for 2015-16 may not be pulling all of your ECEAP children. Teaching Strategies is actively working to resolve this.
 - All 2015-16 ECEAP children should now be archived by *GOLD*®, unless they have re-enrolled. If you have any outliers, send the ELMS ID numbers and class name to del.wa@teachingstrategies.com.
- Reminders:
 - Enter all ECEAP child, teacher, class, and site information into ELMS. It will export into *GOLD*®.
 - Then you must enter the child's actual start date in ELMS before they will export to *GOLD*®.
 - If a child has a previous record in *GOLD*®, make sure that original record has matches the legal name of the child and birthdate entered into ELMS exactly; then the records will merge.
- Changes you can make manually in *GOLD*®:
 - Add a co-teacher or assistant teacher and assign them access to a class. ELMS must add the lead teachers.
 - Disable accounts for teachers no longer associated with your organization.
- *GOLD*® Interrater Reliability (IRR)
 - Lead teachers must complete the *Teaching Strategies GOLD*® IRR certification online within six months of hire and renew every three years thereafter.

Racial Equity

Brain Trust on Dual Language Learners

DEL and OSPI Convened nearly 30 dual language learning experts and advocates for a [state-wide Brain Trust on Dual Language Learners \(DLLs\)](#). The result was lively discussion about how best to recognize, support, and cultivate Washington's rich language diversity in preschool through third grade settings.

Early Educators' Implicit Biases Regarding Sex and Race

This [research study brief](#) examines the potential role of preschool educators' implicit biases as a viable partial explanation behind disparities in preschool expulsions. Findings revealed that when expecting challenging behaviors teachers gazed longer at Black children, especially Black boys. Providing family background information resulted in lowered severity ratings when teacher and child race matched, but resulted in increased severity ratings when their race did not match.

Policies on Dual Language Learners

[The National Institute for Early Education Research 2015 State of Preschool Yearbook](#) provides an in-depth look at state pre-K policies related to these dual language learners (DLLs). This study shows these children benefit most when instruction is provided in both English and their home language without sacrificing English language skill building.

Tackle Preschool Suspensions

This [article](#) talks about nationwide research showing that black children – and especially black boys – are more commonly suspended or expelled in preschool. That puts them at an early, additional disadvantage that exacerbates a persistent achievement gap.

ESSA Pre-K Guidance

The US Department of Education offers [ESSA pre-K Guidance](#):

- The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) creates a major focus on preschool and asks states and districts to pay attention to early childhood education, following a long tradition of starting with kindergarten.
- EdSource reports new guidance from the U.S. Department of Education covers how ESSA funding can be used to train preschool teachers, support English learners as they transition to kindergarten, and finance charter-based preschools.
- ESSA requires schools receiving Title I funds to coordinate with local Head Start programs, at a minimum, and in addition to reiterating this responsibility, the guidance document asks districts to build early childhood education into their own financial planning.

Growth of Technology Use in Early Learning Settings

This [Early Learning and Educational Technology Policy brief](#) promotes developmentally appropriate use of technology in homes and early learning settings. The guidance will help those who care for nearly 36 million children from birth to age eight make wise decisions about media use, and provides four guiding principles for families and early educators on the use of technology with young children.

U.S. Parents Paying for Child Care

This [article](#) indicates that more than 70 percent of parents say the cost of child care is a somewhat or very serious problem. The average cost of day care in the U.S. — \$9,589 per year — edges out the average cost of in-state college tuition at \$9,410.
